"Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen and called its name Ebenezer; for he said, 'Till now the LORD has helped us." 1 Samuel 7:12

Do you have any Ebenezers in your life? I'm guessing this is a question that you haven't ever been asked. And you might even be thinking to yourself right now, "Why is the Pastor asking me if I have any scrooges in my life?" Well, the Ebenezer that I'm looking for has nothing to do with the classic Christmas story, and more to do with God.

Samuel took a large stone and he named it Ebenezer for a very specific reason. It means "stone of help". Why did Samuel do this? I think there were a couple of reasons. First, he wanted a physical reminder for the nation of Israel. You see, God has just saved them by helping them defeat the Philistine army. Samuel knows that there is a good chance the Israelites will forget this miracle unless there is something they can associate it with. Hence, a giant rock in the middle of the battlefield. Those tend to be hard to forget or overlook...

And let's be honest, we forget things too, even huge things that God has done in our life. Why is it so important to remember those times and miracles? It's not just about the event that has happened in the past. It helps us to have hope for whatever circumstance we currently find ourselves in and for the future also. Because if God helped us then, He can help us now. If God was trustworthy then, He is trustworthy now. If God did a miracle in that situation then, He can do a miracle in this situation now. My Grandpa used to say, "God hasn't failed me yet." And if He hasn't failed us in the past, then He's not going to fail us in the present or the future.

I have a rock sitting in the window of my office that I picked up in Rockaway Beach on the Oregon coast. I even remember the day, January 29, 2015. This is my Ebenezer, my stone of help. I can look at it and remember that God has been faithful up to this point, and that gives me hope for whatever may come in the future. So if you answered no to my question at the beginning of this little article, I would encourage you to find something physical and tangible that you can look at to remember what God has done in your life. And then we can join with Robert Robinson, the hymn writer of *Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing*, and say,

"Here I raise my Ebenezer; Here by Thy great help I've come; And I hope, by Thy good pleasure, Safely to arrive at home!"

## PROM THE Youth Pastor»

Amanda and I have been taking the youth through a 12 week series that includes lessons on Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph. We look at many varying themes through the lives of them as individuals, but we are also looking at an overarching theme that seems to surround all of their lives: their Spiritual progression. Everybody has to go through growing pains in their relationship with God. God is constantly molding, meshing, and changing us to prepare us for what He has planned for our lives. This is no different with these four people we read about in Scripture. We have been studying their Spiritual strengths and weaknesses and comparing them to our own. Often times, I feel as though we lift up people we read about in Scripture on a pedestal. We give them credit for the things they accomplished as opposed to giving God the credit for the

way their lives played out. Everybody looks at Moses as the person who freed the Israelites, when in all actuality, Moses would have never done that had God not got his attention and molded Moses into the leader he needed to become.

I feel we do a similar things with our own lives at times. We see success that we have in certain situations, and we credit ourselves for the achievements for which God is responsible. Through this series we have been looking at Spiritual progression of famous Scriptural figures, examining our own lives, and looking to see positive things God is responsible for which we have given ourselves credit. We are working with several students who do not yet know Christ, and this is a great chance to help them recognize the work of God when they haven't always been in recognition of His intervention.

As we continue to examine our lives in this light, we are then asking our students to give some time to God to allow Him to mold them in ways that He needs them changed. We have explained to them the concept of Spiritual, growing pains and also explained that it is not always easy. Sometimes, it is downright painful, and it makes it easy for us to want to give up on the change through which God is bringing about in our lives. We are explaining that we have to die to our old selves and be reborn as God's vessel. We have to repent of things we have done wrong in our lives. This means admitting we have messed up, agreeing that God's way is best, and following in the plan that God has for each of us together and as individuals.

We are working with students who have not always believed in God and still sometimes doubt His existence. Examining the lives of famous people whom students sometimes think are infallible and bringing them to our level has given Amanda and I a great opportunity to show how God works in the lives of His children, even those who we think would not be capable of horrible things. Abraham slept with his maidservant, and Jacob stole his brother's birthright. However, God still used them in mighty ways, and that is the message we are teaching our youth. They are not perfect, but God can use you and can do so in a way they cannot even fathom. ~Michael Vance

## NWYM FRIENDS WOMEN SPRING RALLY 2016 OUR REFUGE


