## **ENDURANCE:**

standing strong in the face of repeated crashing waves A few weeks ago, my family and I had the opportunity to go and spend time on the Coast. It was a time of refreshing, being still, and what one of my Pastor friends has called, "wasting time with God".

God used this time to speak to me in a few different areas of my life, and I want to share one of those with you. If you are familiar with the "Twin Rocks" in the picture you know they are an iconic fixture along the Oregon Coast. As we were standing on the beach one day looking out over the

ocean the realization came to me that those rocks get crashed against moment after moment, day after day, year after year, and they continue to stand firm against the powerful waves.

No matter if the weather is calm and the waves gently wash over them, or if a storm is raging and the water and waves are crashing over their tops, the rocks remain constant. They know how to <u>JUST KEEP STANDING</u>. They don't panic, they don't run away, they don't worry that they will be washed out to sea. They <u>JUST KEEP STANDING</u>.

Now, for me personally I think I do a fairly good job of standing against the waves that the world throws at me. But there are definitely times where I feel completely overwhelmed and I feel like I am drowning. Much like this picture...

I want to run away, I want to panic, I want to worry about all the what ifs, I want to check out of life for a while. But those are times when I am not focusing on God. Those reactions to the waves are not what God wants me to do in the midst of a storm.

In 1 Corinthians 15:58 (KJV) it says, "*Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye* <u>steadfast, unmovable</u>, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." As Christians doing the work of the Lord, we are called to be steadfast and unmovable with the reminder that whatever we do for Him is not ineffective or useless. Those are powerful words to me, and they along with the "Twin Rocks" have been, and will continue to be a good reminder for me to stand firm.



To know that on Christ the solid rock I stand, and all other ground is sinking sand. To know that when the waves start crashing over my head I better be looking at my feet to see where they are planted. To know that no matter the storms going on inside of me or around me Christ is stronger than any of them. "*He drew me up from the pit of destruction, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock making my steps secure*." – Psalm 40:2
