"Beware the Ides of March"

This line from Shakespeare's play is famously known, as well as the story that goes along with it. The murder/ assassination of Julius Caesar by Justus Brutus and other prominent Romans on the 15th of March in 44 B.C. But little is generally known about the actual Ides of March and what it signifies.

In this time period, for the Romans, the Ides of March was mostly notable as a deadline for settling debts. Their calendar featured ides on the 15th in March, May, July, and October or on the 13th in the other months. The word's Latin roots mean "divide," and the date sought to split the month, originally at the rise of the full moon. So, when the middle of the month rolled around if you had a debt to pay you were called upon to settle that debt.

Did you know that you are in debt? No, I didn't steal your identity, hack into your bank account, or get your credit checked. All of humanity is in debt against God. And no matter how much you have in your savings account, your

401k, or in your investment portfolio it will never be enough to settle the debt. What debt could be so big that we will never be able to pay it off? It is the debt of our sin, our trespasses against God, the ways in which we live contrary to Him.

There is only One who can pay this debt, and He has offered to take your place. It is Jesus Christ. He is the holy Son of God who lived a perfect life, died a criminal's death on a cross, defeated sin and death and evil by rising again, and is alive today seated at the right hand of the throne of God. And He says to us that He will take the worst parts of who we are and make them clean, that He will cancel the debt that we have against God, and that we can be put back in good standing with Him. Our debt will be settled.

Last week we read this text from Colossians 2:13-14 as part of the Sermon, "God made (us) alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross." We are made spiritually alive when we acknowledge our sin debt, when we acknowledge who Christ is and what He has done for us, and when we say that we want to follow after Him and have Him wipe the debt clean.

The truth is there will be an Ides of Life, a time that is coming when we will be called to settle the debts of our lives. The Bible says it like this from different passages... "For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God; for it is written, 'As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God.' So then each of us will give an account of himself to God."

"Then I saw a great white throne and him who was seated on it. From his presence earth and sky fled away, and no place was found for them. And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Then another book was opened, which is the book of life. And the dead were judged by what was written in the books, according to what they had done."

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats."

For me, personally, I am ready to settle my debt because I know full well that Christ has already paid it. That when that moment comes and I am called to give an account I will receive the grace of God because of Jesus Christ. Because I have accepted His gift of love, and I have made Him the Savior of my life. Do you know what you will do when the Ides of Life come?
