



WORDS FROM OUR PASTOR

Good morning!

Last Sunday I preached a message on the vision of God for each of us individually and for our Church collectively. Within that, I would love for you to join me in a few things:

1. Praying about what vision God has for your life personally, and then sharing that with myself and/or the church.
2. Praying about what vision God has for MFCC. What unique vision does the Lord have for us in this season? I think of Nehemiah in the Old Testament who had a vision to restore the wall around Jerusalem. He shared his vision, people responded both positively and negatively, but God's plans prevailed.

I also think about the disciples in the book of Acts, who had the vision to start the church, share the Gospel, and call people to repentance and faith in Jesus. They shared their vision and they too had people respond positively and receive the Holy Spirit. They also faced persecution, trials, and suffering. Yet, here we are thousands of years later a product of their faithfulness.

I have one vision that I would like to share with you, and for you to join me in prayer about. One of the great things about the Quaker/Friends denomination is group discernment; taking time to sit with something, pray about it, and then to have everyone involved act together as one moving forward knowing that God is leading.

Since the beginning of 2018 I have felt nudged by God to begin praying about planting a new Friends churches in Central Oregon. As of right now, MFCC is the only Evangelical Friends Church in Central Oregon. The closest church in proximity to us is Clackamas Park Friends Church in Portland.

There are three growing cities in Central Oregon, and they are projected to continue to grow in the future. Bend, Redmond, and Prineville are all situated to grow substantially in the next 10-20 years. (Maybe not something we want to hear! But true non-the-less!)

Back in 1953 people had a vision to start MFCC as there was no Evangelical Friends Church in Central Oregon.

Some of those people are still a part of our congregation today. Look where their vision has brought us! I am thankful that they were patient for the Lord's vision, they received His vision, and then they acted on His vision for Metolius Friends Community Church.

Would you pray about the possibility of MFCC being a "Mother Church" to churches in Central Oregon? As I mentioned above, this is a very early vision, but I would like to journey along it with you. There are questions to be asked, discussions to be had, logistics to be discovered, and ultimately there are people who need to hear about Jesus.

I am so thankful to be a part of MFCC and what God is doing here in and through us. I wouldn't and don't want to be anywhere else. My prayer is that you feel the same, that you are excited about God being in our midst, and ready for what God wants to do.




